

The Lórd will yíeld from Zíon † your scépter of pówer: * rúle in the mídst of all your fóes.


A prínce from the dáy of your bírth † on the hóly móuntains; * from the wómb before the dáwn I begót you.

The Máster stánding at your ríght hand * will shátter kíngs in the dáy of his wráth.



and the hílls like yéarling shéep.


Whý was it, séa, that you fléd, *
